

A Teacher's HOAP

Two years ago, IHT received a request for funding through the Home Ownership Assistance Program (HOAP), which grants down payments to prospective homeowners. This is not an unusual occurrence, but this request was a bit different.

Amber Newman, a kindergarten teacher on MDI, sent a letter to IHT's board with a request for help in obtaining a HOAP grant. She'd done the rental shuffle for several years. Amber remembers, "As a single woman, that was okay. I could move and find another rental when my current rental was sold, or priced out of my range, or changed to weekly rentals. However, that all changed when I became a mother. I knew that I wanted to build financial security

for her, and for her future."

As time passed, Amber grew more concerned about her chances of finding a home on MDI. She learned from her friends about a program where modular home builders buy land, place houses on them, and then sell them. A turnkey project like this could make homeownership possible.

As Amber looked into a modular home, she did lots of research on costs and materials, met with banks, and worked with builders. Ultimately, she found what she was looking for in Bar Harbor. The only thing lacking were funds for the down payment.

Amber reached out to IHT for help, writing that she was "never one to ask for financial support. I was

raised to work hard for that myself. However, after careful consideration, and a lot of conversations with IHT, I believe a HOAP grant is the thing that will make our dream of home ownership, here on our island that we love and live and work on, a reality." Amber went on to write, "Our own home could give my daughter the stability she deserves, year-round and long-term, after living in three houses in six short years. And it could be the thing that ensures that I can continue to be a teacher who lives in my own community, with my own students."

This was a new option for IHT and HOAP. No one had ever inquired about building a new house and using HOAP funds to help finance the purchase. The board reviewed

the request and voted to approve the HOAP funds for this purchase. Amber would get her forever house!

As always with construction projects, things take longer than anticipated, and working through a pandemic and shortages of staff and materials made things even worse. Amber's home was delivered in

December 2021, a beautiful red cape nestled in the trees. But things still progressed slowly and it was August 2022 when the work was completed and Amber and her family could move in to their very own home.

Amber is more than delighted. "IHT made our dream of home ownership come true, here on this island that we

love, and live and work on. For almost 20 years I've wanted to own my own home on MDI but costs had always kept houses just out of my reach. With IHT's help, I now own a home where we can build the financial security of our family, and ensure our daughter's future here in this place we call home," she said, smiling.

For those of us lucky enough to live here, it's a wonderful time of year. And it's at the heart of what Island Housing Trust is working toward: supporting the viability of our communities and creating opportunities for those who work here to live on the island year-round.

This year IHT has built six new homes on MDI and helped secure two more homes for ongoing yearround residence. Since 2003, we have provided 50 year-round housing opportunities, and currently hold covenants on 39 homes which ensure that these homes will remain affordable to our island workforce to live in year round. Next year, IHT will build four more houses at Jones Marsh, and will begin the

third and final phase of the Ripples Hill neighborhood that will provide up to 10 more island homes.



IHT's work is possible because of community support-from individuals, towns, businesses, partners. We're preparing for the next four units to be placed in spring 2023. At completion in 2023, 10 new units will house MDI workers and their families.
