### NEW to the neighborhoods



In 2019, for the first time in our history, IHT had three houses for sale and in January 2020, we helped a homeowner keep her home. We are so pleased to introduce you to the newest homeowners to our neighborhoods:

Margaret Houghton and her son, Oliver, are the new owners of the house in Northeast Harbor that IHT purchased and renovated, then sold using a lottery process. They have been seasonal renters in Northeast Harbor and Islesford for several years, and wanted to remain in Northeast Harbor as year-round residents. With the assistance of IHT and The Stroud Fund, Margaret and Oliver now have a permanent home on MDI.

Tony Dalisio, Susan Swift, and their toddler, Amelia, are the new owners of the house donated anonymously to IHT and moved onto land donated by the Town of Mount Desert. Susan grew up on MDI and works at MDI High School and Camp Beechcliff. Tony is a baker, cooking instructor, wrestling coach, and stay-at-home dad to Amelia. They are delighted to be on MDI where Amelia can grow up near her grandparents.

On Christmas Eve, IHT closed on its sale of a house in the Ripples Hill neighborhood in Somesville to **Christina Spurling**. Christina is the music director at the Somesville Union Meeting Housing and a collaborative pianist at Colby College. She was delighted to find an affordable home with an addition for her music room, where she now teaches piano lessons. Her partner, Jacob Cuff, also a musician, owns and operates Sweet Peas Cafe in Salisbury Cove. He is originally from Bath, ME. Christina is originally from Little Cranberry Island.

"When I started working at Colby, I was enticed by the housing market in Waterville but my heart wanted me to live here. I'm really grateful that IHT made it possible for me to remain on this island. I feel very lucky to have a home for me and my piano and a place to work safely during the pandemic. The neighbors are wonderful and have become like family." Christina Spurling

IHT kicked off 2020 providing <u>Home Ownership Assistance Program (HOAP)</u> funding to help a long-time resident, **Mary Ann (Mac) Sheets**, keep her home. IHT worked with Mary Anne to bridge the financing gap she faced in trying to purchase her home of 30+ years as part of a divorce settlement. HOAP is one of the most flexible tools we have to work with home buyers, making it possible to meet down payment requirements that are often the only obstacle to acquiring an otherwise affordable mortgage.

Island Housing Trust is moving forward with the permitting and planning phase for a new neighborhood at the head of Mount Desert Island. Jones Marsh will be a neighborhood of 10 energy-efficient homes on approximately seven acres, with the option for two duplexes to provide a diverse price point for



ownership. IHT staff is working with local modular companies to develop an energy efficient building, with a New England farmhouse design.

As we all adapt to our new responsibilities of addressing Covid-19 in our lives and businesses, IHT is assessing what work can be undertaken now, what a likely timeline for completion might be, and when our target homeowners – those earning a median income working on MDI – might be prepared to undertake the purchase of a new home.
